

Impacts of Private Schools on Character Development

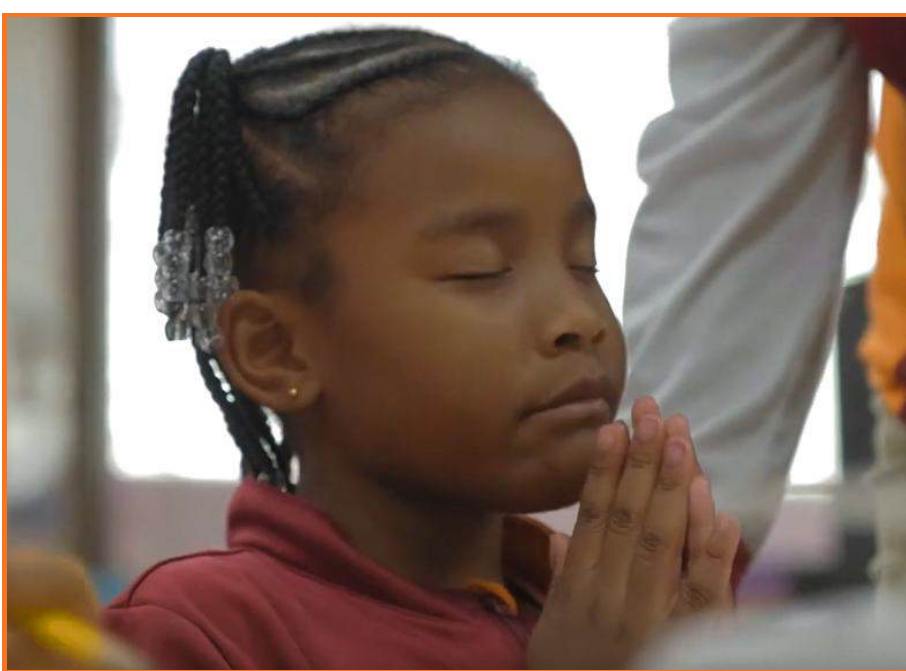
1. What Character Development Looks Like in a School Setting
